1. INTRODUCTION

We, the VISION FOR DEVELOPMENT ALLIANCE (VIDA), present this manifesto as a guide for a better future for all Kenyans. We are believers of Social democracy committed to the spirit of social justice, economic growth, and individual liberty. This manifesto draws its inspiration from the party ideology. It is a practical articulation of incorruptible social democracy ideology. It defines a detailed vision for Kenya, focused on addressing the pressing issues facing our nation while upholding the principles of social justice, economic growth, and individual liberty. Our ideological policies aim to address the nation's sustainability for growth and development with a focus for prosperous future generations. The VIDA administration shall operate within the Constitution of Kenya, Political Parties Act, 2011, VIDA's Constitution and Rules, and other legislations.

2.0 VIDA'S PRIORITIES TO THE ECONOMIC TRANSFORMATION

2.1. ROLL OUT A WORKING COUNTRY

We have a very educated, energetic, hardworking and enthusiastic population that is ready to work. However the unemployment rate skyrockets everyday due to limited employment opportunities in the country. As VIDA, we shall ensure all Kenyans get into well-protected decent jobs so as to contribute into the national development. To address the issue of unemployment, we shall interrogate our tax policies and other factors that adversely affect industrialization, agriculture, mining and small scale businesses. We have to investigate both macro and micro economic elements so as to cure unemployment menace once and for all.

2.1.3 Job Plan for the VIDA Government:

In the next 2 years, VIDA shall:

- (i) Expand employment opportunities in the public sector- the state shall expand its recruitment opportunities in the government agencies such as ministries, parastatals and other institutions through public service commission. This procedure shall provide equal opportunities to all unemployed graduates. The graduates shall be expected to produce significantly into the economies GDP so as to commensurate their pay. Through the ministry of public service VIDA government shall allocate sufficient resources to cater for salaries. We shall configure a vibrant National youth Service and national polytechnics to cater for the

technical works and commensurate the youth with a reasonable capital amount to start business of their inspirations.

- (ii) Re-examine the validity of all AGPO enterprises so as to identify genuine beneficiaries. Further VIDA government shall consider a fast payment for the services offered by AGPO firms.
- (iii) Establish a non-discriminative policy for a well-balanced, regional, gender, age, tribe and physical abilities employment measures.

2.2. INDUSTRIALIZATION

For the transformation of our economy, VIDA shall drive industrial growth to 50% in the first 2 years in office. This involves targeted strategies to revitalize and diversify the manufacturing sector, foster a more inclusive and robust national and international markets, enhance training for workers and meet the new global challenge of climate change. A just transition to a cleaner, greener future can lead to new jobs and secure the competitiveness of our products and services in both the local and export markets.

2.2.1 Plan for the Industrial Growth

In the next two years, VIDA government shall:

- (i) Establish industrial and sectoral master plans into a comprehensive industrial policy to drive the intended changes for a robust economic growth.
- (ii) Prioritize industrial sectors that are labor intensive.
- (iii) Cultivate the spirit of partnerships to expand cottage industries to create sustainable employment in various sectors such as; mining, agriculture, energy, manufacturing, pharmaceuticals and medical sectors, environment, tourism, media and the digital economy.
- (iv) Enhance coordination of all national government departments and agencies and county governments for the implementation of sectoral master plans and Industrial Policy Action Plans.
- (v) Waive the export taxes for the locally produced goods so that we can have competitive prices in our global markets.
- (vi) Empower agricultural sector for food and nutrition security for a health and energetic working population.
- (vii) Promote and provide incentives for rural development so that the working population can stop rural-urban migration that constrains the limited resources

- (viii) Provision of affordable energy- VIDA government shall relook into the electricity tariffs so as to attract the investors for manufacturing and lower the production cost for our goods and services
- (ix) Mitigate the effects of climate change, embrace technological changes and ensure that Kenya's transition to a low-carbon economy supports communities and workers in affected rural and urban areas.
- (x) Expand the local digital environment by creating affordable universal access to broadband.
- (xi) Establish creative industries and digital hubs in townships and rural areas for digital content production in every ward. This will involve the skills in animation, gaming, virtual reality and augmented reality, photography, graphic design, sound production, audio design, film and video production, digital art production, transmedia and digital marketing.
- (xii) Provide incentives to all local manufacturers for goods and supplies.
- (xiii) Promote entrepreneurship, innovation and investment in emerging industries like renewable energy, sustainable tourism, e-commerce and agro-technology
- (xiv) For jobs, food and nutrition, we shall Support small-scale fishing cooperatives by providing a viable basket of species and excavation of free fish ponds across the country through the ministry of agriculture.
- (xv) Through the ministry of foreign and diaspora affairs, trade and industrialization, we shall work around the clock to improve our bilateral relations with countries for our export markets for goods and services.
- (xvi) Ensure the central bank lending base rate is friendly for expansive macro and micro economy that promotes industrialization including cottage industries.

2.2.2 Plan for the Infrastructure Development

In the next 5 years, the VIDA shall:

- (i) Upon taking up the government, VIDA shall take the stock of all incomplete infrastructural projects, prospective projects and ones in need of improvement. We shall complete all started but incomplete within 2 years. Repairs and maintenance within the 3 years and thereafter start the development of new projects. The infrastructure development involve; energy, roads, bridges, railways, network and water infrastructures.
- (ii) Improve capacity, including technical and planning for project management personnel, to maintain all public infrastructure.

- (iii) Establish mechanism for fire and other disasters risks mitigation measures.
- (iv) Consider expansion of the power grid so that more energy, including from renewable sources, can be transmitted.
- (v) Reinstate Mombasa oil refinery with enhanced capacity for cost efficiency for both domestic and international markets.
- (vi) Modernize all commuter rail networks across the nation to the standard gauge railway for efficient transport of public and goods.
- (vii) Restructure all the terminus including sea ports, airport and bus terminus to the modern standards for efficient service delivery.

2.2.3 Plan to Transform Financial Sector to Support Employment and Industrialization

The Kenyan financial sector needs to be properly regulated in order to foster capital for investors across the sector. The government must stop local borrowing from financial institutions so that they can avail affordable credit to the private investors. We must regulate who can purchase government treasury bills and bonds. Financial institutions should allow other organizations and private citizens to purchase the government bills and bonds. All other lenders in the market shall be regulated against exorbitant lending rates to Kenyan citizens.

In the next 3 years, VIDA shall:

- (i) Engage and direct financial institutions to invest a portion of their funds in agriculture, trade and industrialization.
- (ii) Shall allocate agricultural stimuli funds as incentives to lure youth in farming. The policy shall be run through Agricultural Finance corporation bank (AFC)
- (iii) Allocate insurance fund for lenders to cover up non-performing loan facilities to new venture starters.

2.2.4 Plan to Pursue a Developmental Macroeconomic Framework

Create more opportunities for young people who play a vital role in shaping our democratic space. Their advocacy, creativity; energy and activism on a range of issues often push us to reconsider our policies

In the next 3 years, the VIDA shall:

- (i) Reconcile all government policies with this manifesto

- (ii) Coordinate fiscal and monetary policies, including interest and exchanges rates, towards supporting sustainable growth.
- (iii) Mobilize additional domestic and international resources to support priorities in this Manifesto including through progressive tax reforms and other measures.
- (v) Address the crisis of young people not in employment, education or training through increased efforts to reduce the number of learners who do not finish school and providing second chance opportunities to pass matrix through community and TVET colleges.
- (vi) Prioritize young people in public and other work programmes, work-based learning programmes, artisan training and entrepreneurship programmes.
- (vii) Expand and institutionalize the National Youth Service in partnership with other players targeting young men and women.
- (viii) Working together with young people, their organizations and institutions, with families and sectoral formations, to tackle teenage pregnancy, crime, gender-based violence, sexually transmitted infections and HIV/AIDS.
- (ix) Increase enrolment and graduation of students in universities, TVET colleges and community education and training colleges, particularly for students with disabilities.
- (x) Implement a national youth plan to tackle drug and substance abuse, embracing prevention and education in schools and communities, counselling, treatment and support. There shall be stricter monitoring of underage drinking and taverns near schools, recreation programmes and peer-led interventions and law enforcement to clamp down on the flooding of communities with illegal drugs.
- (xi) Strengthen youth health services, including access to sanitary towels for girls and young women, including making them available in schools, universities and other public spaces.

2.3. THE HIGH COST OF LIVING

VIDA shall re-evaluate both micro and macroeconomics so as to address the national inflation that devalues the citizens' purchasing power of their disposable income. A high level of inflation is a recipe for poverty. This in one side dictates that we reduce the tax as internal mechanism.

2.3.1 Plan to Strengthen Comprehensive Social Security

In the next 1 year, VIDA shall:

- (i) Reduce tax regimes to lower the inflation and poverty consequently.
- (ii) Prevent vulnerability and destitution as a result of the loss of income through social insurance for workers.
- (iv) Ensure the National Minimum Wage increases in line with inflation and ensure compliance.
- (v) Protect the value of social grants for children, the elderly and persons with disability.

2.3.2 Plan to Reduce the Cost of Living

In the first 2years, VIDA shall:

- (i) Lower the cost of living through zero rating most essential goods, support food security through agricultural reforms, and tax reviews.
- (ii) Ensure basic services are affordable by maintaining and expanding subsidies in basic services like water, fuel and electricity.
- (iii) Improve the budget allocation for the National Health Insurance so as to make medical care affordable to all.

2.4 INVESTMENT IN PEOPLE

VIDA government shall invest in its citizens through affordable education and free medical care services up to level 5 hospitals. The government shall benefit more from well-educated and healthy society.

2.4.1 Plan to Ensure County Government Delivers

In the next 2 years, VIDA shall:

- (i) Establish a presidential delivery unit (PDU)that will ensure all government projects are well coordinated to achieve its mandate
- (ii) Ensure PDU is given greater responsibilities to support functional areas that struggle to provide services to communities.
- (iii) (ii) Ensure that representatives its PDU held accountable for the basic services to communities that form part of their responsibilities and our Manifesto undertaking to fill critical vacancies with qualified people.
- (ii) Track implementation through PDU the VIDA County Government Monitoring unit and act against public representatives who are not performing, which may include their recall.

3.0 WATER

In the next 2 years, VIDA shall:

- (i) Shall devolve water provision services to the county governments together with resources to develop water supply infrastructures.
- (ii) Shall ensure there is a well network for irrigation water to every household within the boundaries of the nation to foster agricultural production and make Kenya the global food basket.
- (iii) Devolve all water organs to county levels to ensure service gets closer the people.
- (iv) Complete in the first 2 years the major dams and water schemes to ensure sustainable access to water for Kenya's growing population.

4.0 TRANSPORT

In the next 3 years, VIDA shall:

- (i) Fix potholes, pave roads and maintain rural roads, as well as other road feeder roads.
- (ii) To increase the budget for KeRRA so that that they can increase the number of accessible roads in the rural areas.
- (iii) Develop more standard gauge railways for ease of cargo and passenger transport across the nation.
- (iv) For safety purposes, all public transport vehicles must be fixed with speed governors and the valid certificate of inspection must be displayed.
- (v) The compliant boda boda operators shall be empowered by the government financially.

5.0 EDUCATION

Education is key to success .no society can prosper without investing in education for its citizens. Education, health, science and technology therefore remain key areas through which the VIDA pledges to continuously transform.

In the next 3years, VIDA shall:

- (i) Ensure universal access to quality early child development education.
- (ii) Shall review the funding models for the higher learning institutions to accommodate every citizen willing to further their studies.

- (iii) Through the ministry of education shall enter into partnership with global institutions and offer scholarships to specialists of certain discipline.
- (iv) Increase the uptake of paid up internship program to our youth for increased skilled labour market.
- (v) Expand vocational and technical training in schools and post school institutions and build additional TVET and community colleges.
- (vi) Provide more digital learning opportunities; invest in specialist medical training and second chance and lifelong learning opportunities.

6.0 HEALTH AND SANITATION

In the next 2 years, the VIDA shall:

- (i) Promote healthy lifestyles and preventive health care campaigns.
- (ii) Move decisively towards implementing the National Health Insurance, strengthening health infrastructure, training personnel and creating a single electronic health record.
- (iii) Expand the Idea Clinic program to improve quality of care.
- (iv) Strengthen financial management and supply chain management in public health institutions.
- (v) Collaborate with other countries on research and development of traditional medicine.
- (vi) Leverage new technologies like telemedicine and artificial intelligence in health care.
- (vii) Manage rapid urbanization through a sustainable model of compact, connected cities and towns, urban and rural areas, including the development of new cities and towns.

7.0 SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY

7.1 Plan to use Science and Innovation for Development

In the next 3 years, the VIDA shall:

- (i) Support innovation in green technologies, climate change adaptation and mitigation, and de-carbonization programmes.
- (ii) Increase research and development spending and prioritize areas like industrialization, climate change and technologies like virtual reality, augmented reality, block chain, artificial intelligence and the internet of things

- (iii) Foster development of new and existing industries, increase patent development and strengthen local innovation systems, including green energy technologies.
- (v) Contribute to the African Union's goal of producing 100,000 PhD graduates in science, technology, engineering and mathematics in the next decade.

8.0 HOUSING

8.1 Plan to Build More Houses and Provide Basic Services to All

In the next 3 years, the VIDA shall:

- (i) Continue building subsidized housing for vulnerable groups.
- (ii) Increase land availability near economic centers for youth, military veterans and seniors.
- (iii) Establish a Human Settlement Bank for affordable financing.
- (iv) Upgrade informal settlements and provide basic services.
- (v) Strengthen regulation of rental prices and protect consumers.
- (vi) Improve access to clean water and increase bulk water infrastructure.
- (vii) Expand sanitation access through alternative technologies.
- (viii) Address challenges with wastewater treatment plants.
- (ix) Ensure safe drinking water and prevent pollution of water sources.

9.0 DEFEND DEMOCRACY AND FREEDOMS

9.1 Plans to Keeping Our Homes and Streets Safe, Protect Our Borders

In the next 2 years, the VIDA shall:

- (i) Take a comprehensive approach to fighting crime through the Integrated Violence and Crime Prevention Strategy.
- (ii) Modernize policing.
- (iii) Highlight the critical role of communities in preventing crime and gender-based violence through adequate resourcing of Community Policing Forums.
- (iv) Develop capabilities to combat cybercrime, essential infrastructure crimes, illegal firearms, gang violence, crime syndicates, human and drug trafficking, and corruption.
- (v) Provide additional capacity to the Hawks to tackle organized crime.

- (vi) Implement a data-driven approach to target violent crime hotspots and direct police resources and personnel to areas with the highest crime rates.
- (vii) Strengthen the justice system, review the Criminal Procedures Act, reducing case backlogs and delays, support the Legal Aid Board to provide fair access to justice, introduce
- (viii) Technology to make court procedures more efficient and accessible, and strengthen the protection of whistleblowers.
- (ix) Ensure effective and humane incarceration of inmates, and, as part of a restorative justice approach, promote the rehabilitation and social reintegration of offenders.

9.2 Plans to End Gender-Based Violence

In the next 1-2 years, the VIDA shall:

- (i) Implement the National Strategic Plan on Gender-Based Violence
- (ii) Expand victim support services and GBV desks in police stations.
- (ii) Undertake public campaigns against toxic masculinity, and sexism.
- (iv) Promote gender equality and the empowerment of women and girls.
- (v) Promote adherence, working with trade unions and businesses, to ILO Convention 190 to eradicate violence and harassment in the workplace.

9.3 Plans to address the illegal Immigration

In the next 2 years, the VIDA shall:

- (i) Complete the overhaul of our immigration policy and systems including the Citizenship Act, Refugees Act and Immigration Act, towards a single law dealing with citizenship, immigration and refugees to prevent contradictions and meet the new challenges facing Kenya.
- (ii) Relocate refugee and asylum centers close to border post.
- (iii) Regulate employment of foreign workers in line with the National Labor Migration Policy, to give preference to Kenyan job-seekers and act against employment and exploitation of undocumented persons.
- (iv) Simplify visa applications.
- (v) Use technology to modernize systems to prevent fraud and bogus documents.

10.0 FIGHT AGAINST CORRUPTION

10.1 Plans to Fight Corruption

Kenya is yet to strengthen its capability to prevent and fight corruption. Little action is being taken against alleged perpetrators of state capture, where public funds are lost. We shall require VIDA members charged in a court of law to step-aside from organizational and state responsibilities until the case is finalized. The VIDA shall strengthen the selection criteria for public representatives' candidates, prioritizing skills, educational knowledge, experience and integrity.

Over the next 2 years, the VIDA shall:

- (i) Strengthen law EACC and Restructure the DPP's office for speedy execution of economic crimes perpetrators.
- (ii) Establish the Investigating Directorate as a permanent entity within the investigating powers.
- (iii) Ensure greater accountability and prevent corruption through rigorous lifestyle audits and improved vetting procedures, real-time audits of critical projects, using artificial intelligence to improve accountability and transparency and strengthen discipline management.
- (iv) Build a social compact against corruption with law enforcement and citizens, launch public awareness campaigns to educate and encourage reporting, and support community involvement and whistle blower protection.

11.0 PLAN TO BUILDING THE DEVELOPMENTAL STATE

A capable, developmental and ethical state is critical to the achievement of a better life for all. As a country, we seek to build a developmental state designed by the history and socio- economic dynamics of Kenyan society, to guide national economic development and mobilize domestic and foreign capital and other social partners to achieve this goal.

It shall have attributes that include:

- (i) Capacity to intervene in the economy in the interest of higher rates of growth and sustainable development.
- (ii) Influencing sustainable programmes that address unemployment, poverty and underdevelopment with emphasis on vulnerable groups;

(iii) Mobilizing the people as a whole, especially the poor, to act as their own liberators through participatory and representative democracy. We shall continue to strengthen state institutions with technical capacity and skilled personnel and shall ensure greater coordination and planning of service provision, with the active involvement of citizens. We shall reduce the reliance on outsourcing services, which has weakened the state's capability as competencies critical for implementation is not developed in the state.

11.1 To improve the capability of the state, VIDA shall in the next 3 years:

- (i) Strengthen planning and project implementation capabilities, improve monitoring and evaluation tools and attract, develop and retain skilled personnel across government.
- (ii) Take forward initiatives to build a professional, ethical and developmental public service.
- (iii) Advance e-government and digital services to make government services accessible, interoperable and efficient.
- (iv) Work with labour, civil society and business on social and economic initiatives.
- (v) Increase disaster response capacity and funding.
- (vi) Improve the capacity of Parliament and legislatures to fulfil their legislative, oversight and accountability responsibilities.
- (vii) Protect judicial independence and increase access to justice.
- (viii) Support institutions that uphold democracy.
- (ix) Promote media diversity and control cyber bullying, fake news and promote ethical language in use of social media.

12.0 .PROMOTING NATION BUILDING AND SOCIAL COHESION

The VIDA envisions promoting policies and programmes to heal the divisions of the past and build a socially cohesive Kenya, protecting and promoting our languages and Kenya's international relations shall reflect its belief in a multilateral world order where equity, human rights, and sustainability are prioritized. This vision shall be advanced through:

Cultural heritage we shall implement policies that promote non-tribalism and non-sexism and oppose any form of discrimination.

The programmes shall be implemented in housing, education, health care and social security shall all contribute to building a society where everyone feels included and has the opportunity to thrive.

Over the next 2 years, the VIDA shall:

- (i) Continue to protect and expand the social and economic gains we have achieved.
- (ii) Ensure no one is left behind and foster social cohesion.
- (iii) Strengthen support for families.
- (iv) Continuously promote and protect languages and our diverse cultures.

- (vi) Take measures to ensure the sustainability of the public broadcaster to fulfil its mandate and develop funding mechanisms to support local content and the creative industry
- (vii) Advance a united republic of Kenya against attempts to divide the nation and its people.
- (viii) Protect our national sovereignty and national security as a nation.

13.0 .BUILD A BETTER AFRICA AND WORLD

Our foreign policy is rooted in the enduring values of peace, friendship, and mutual respect, as articulated in the founding principles of the Freedom Charter. Guided by the vision of a united and prosperous Africa and a just global order, Kenya shall continue to champion these ideals on the international stage.

13.1 Kenya's Commitment to Africa

The Republic of Kenya remains steadfast in its commitment to the African Union (AU) and the realization of Agenda 2063, which envisions an Africa that is integrated, peaceful, democratic, and economically empowered.
